RULES

- **1.** Please refer to the general rules.
- 2. Sections: In any section where there are less than two (2) competitors, sections may be combined, deleted, or cancelled at the discretion of the Leeton Eisteddfod Committee, prior to the commencement of the Eisteddfod. If there are insufficient entries in some sections, the age restrictions or students may be asked to perform in an alternative age group.

To allow students to gain experience dancing on stage, if there is only one entry and the section is still allowed to continue (at the dance convenors discretion) no placing will be issued, only critique will be given.

- 3. **Prizes:** Will be awarded at the convenors and or adjudicator's discretion, as follows:
 - 12 years and 8 years medals may be awarded, where applicable.
 - Primary School, 1st Prize at \$25 and 2nd Prize at \$15 may be awarded, where applicable.
- 4. **Child Protection**, due to child protection policies, no photography is allowed of performers onstage, backstage or dressing room areas, except by the official photographer registered with Leeton Eisteddfod Society Inc who will be wearing a vest. Offenders may be asked to leave.

Leeton Eisteddfod Society Inc. takes the safety of children and vulnerable people seriously. We follow all guidelines as per the Office of the Children's Guardian and ensure that all members, volunteers, teachers, and adjudicators also comply.

DEBATING RULES

- **1.** Teams will be advised of the topic in the week commencing 4 August 2024 affirmative or negative.
- 2. Teachers must ensure that any debater competing in more than one debate does not speak in the same position in both debates. E.g. if they were the 1st speaker in the 1st debate, they cannot be the 1st speaker in subsequent debates.
- **3.** Schools need to advise the Speech and Drama Convenor NO LATER than 4pm on **Tuesday 30 July 2024** via <u>leetoneisteddfod@gmail.com</u> if they intend to withdraw, and if possible, get a replacement team.
